Prof. Dr. Ummu Salma Bava

is Professor and Jean Monnet Chair at the Center for European Studies of Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) in New Delhi. She is one of India's leading experts on the foreign and security policy of the EU, India and Germany. In addition, she is a member of the Research Advisory Council of the Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik (SWP) and a recipient of the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany (Bundesverdienstkreuz).

How has India emerged on the global stage in the last three decades against the backdrop of the end of the Cold War?

How has this impacted the political, economic and civil society dimensions and transformed the country? Given the changing geopolitical landscape, the lecture will examine how India and Europe are engaging with one another and also being defined by the developments around them at the regional and global levels.
